What are podcasts?

The term podcasting is an amalgam of the word broadcasting and the name of the popular MP3 player called the "iPod." A podcast is basically a downloadable audio or video file that can be played back on any iPod, any other MP3 player, or a computer. By using podcatching software, such as iTunes or Juice, you can automatically download new podcast episodes for free.
