Interprofessional Education Scholar Award

The Interprofessional Education Scholar Award recognizes an individual or team who has demonstrated excellence in interprofessional education. This includes teaching in an interprofessional learning environment, disseminating the results and best practices of interprofessional education, and contributing locally, regionally, or nationally to the advancement of interprofessional education. Focus will be on work done while at UNMC.

NOTE: If you are applying as a team (2-5 members), email iae@unmc.edu for further details; all team members share the award.

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES

- **Rank:** All full-time or part-time UNMC faculty members in an educational role are eligible except UNMC Deans (Associate Deans are eligible), Institute Directors, Hospital CEO, Vice Chancellors, or Chancellor; if you are applying as a team, all individuals must be UNMC faculty members
- **Experience:** UNMC faculty member for 2 or more years (from award submission deadline)
- Past recipients of this award will be re-eligible in 5 years

AWARD CRITERIA

- Demonstration and modeling highly collaborative interactions with colleagues from other educational disciplines as defined by the four IPEC Competencies (<https://www.ipecollaborative.org/ipec-core-competencies>)
- Use of creative interprofessional teaching methods
- Development of interprofessional curriculum and instructional materials used locally, regionally or nationally
- Mentoring of other interprofessional educators at UNMC
- Receipt of local, regional or national interprofessional teaching awards
- Peer-reviewed publications or presentations in interprofessional education
- Leadership roles in national organizations supporting interprofessional education
- Evidence of grant funding in the area of interprofessional education

NOMINATION MATERIALS

1. Nomination Form

Submitted nomination form (self-nominations welcome)

2. Personal Statement

Candidates will **receive a link** to complete their personal statement within Microsoft Forms. Personal statement must emphasize evidence of award criteria.

3. Portfolio

Portfolios include artifacts that support accomplishments submitted in their personal statement.

1. Supporting evidence of award criteria
2. A summary table of learner or activity evaluations or feedback that provide support of interprofessional education activities is encouraged

4. Letters of Support

Candidates **submit at least two letters** of support that address the award criteria. A maximum of three letters is permitted.

Letters of support may be received from learners (students, residents and fellows), staff or faculty members at UNMC or collaborators from other institutions. A letter from a supervisor or candidate's chair may be submitted but is not required.

5. CV

Current CV formatted using UNMC guidelines. Information supporting the award should be highlighted in yellow.
