History of the White Coat

The Professionalism Ceremony is a rite of passage for students in the College of Allied Health Professions to begin their professional program or clinical encounters with patients. The ceremony focuses on professionalism, encompassing the concepts of ethical behavior, compassionate care, and service to others. During this ceremony, we give students their first white coat and they recite an oath to remind them of the high standards expected of them.

The reception of the white coat is an acknowledgement by the student of a unique privilege and responsibility to enter the lives of patients in a special and honored way. The white coat conveys an unspoken message that the wearer is dedicated to the highest principles of respect, competency, service, and integrity.

The White Coat Ceremony, first introduced in 1993, has since become a tradition at medical schools throughout the US. Several other professional groups also utilize the ceremony as a way to convey the principles of professionalism to students beginning their health care education.

Teresa Cochran is an Associate Professor of Physical Therapy and Assistant Dean for the College of Allied Health Professions at the Health Science Education Complex on the Kearney campus, joining UNMC in 2017. Originally from southwest Iowa, Teresa earned a Master of Arts degree in Psychology from the University of Nebraska, a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from Creighton University and has held national board certification in Geriatrics from the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties since 2001.

Following practice in Alabama, Teresa returned to develop rehabilitation practices on the Omaha and Winnebago Indian Reservations in northeast Nebraska, specializing in vestibular rehabilitation and care for older adults with balance dysfunction. She spent 15 years on the Creighton University Physical Therapy faculty, serving as Vice Chair and directing the Office of Interprofessional Scholarship, Service and Education. She has served as Federal Affairs Liaison and Past President of the American Physical Therapy Association–Nebraska Chapter, and currently chairs the state Ethics committee. Teresa also chairs the Student Engagement Group for the American Interprofessional Health Collaborative and in 2016 was inducted as a Distinguished Fellow of the National Academies of Practice, the only interprofessional, nonprofit group to advise the US Congress on policies that support interprofessional education and team-based health care delivery.

Teresa enjoys landscape painting, learning to play the bagpipes and watching the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park.

Clinical Perfusion

Clinical Perfusionists run a complicated machine that works like a person's heart and lungs. This keeps a person alive while their heart is stopped for open-heart surgery. The perfusionist also runs equipment that saves and cleans blood during operations. The program is 21 months, leading to a Master of Perfusion Science degree.

The program is nine months, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging & Therapeutic Sciences degree or Post-Baccalaureate Professional Certificate in Cardiovascular Interventional Technology.
