History of the White Coat

The Professionalism Ceremony is a rite of passage for students in the College of Allied Health Professions to begin their professional program or clinical encounters with patients. The ceremony focuses on professionalism, encompassing the concepts of ethical behavior, compassionate care, and service to others. During this ceremony, we give students their first white coat and they recite an oath to remind them of the high standards expected of them.

The reception of the white coat is an acknowledgement by the student of a unique privilege and responsibility to enter the lives of patients in a special and honored way. The white coat conveys an unspoken message that the wearer is dedicated to the highest principles of respect, competency, service, and integrity.

The White Coat Ceremony, first introduced in 1993, has since become a tradition at medical schools throughout the US. Several other professional groups also utilize the ceremony as a way to convey the principles of professionalism to students beginning their health care education.

Keynote Speaker

H. Dele Davies, MD Interim Chancellor University of Nebraska Medical Center



H. Dele Davies, MD, serves as the interim chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center. In this role, Dr. Davies is responsible for all aspects of campus leadership, program quality and operations, including six colleges, a graduate studies program, two degree-granting institutes, the professional staff and faculty of more than 6,000, and 4,500 health professions students. Initially appointed as vice chancellor in 2012, he was promoted in 2017 to senior vice chancellor, with expanded responsibilities and direct oversight of all UNMC colleges and a health sciences library. He has served as dean of graduate studies since joining UNMC.

Prior to joining UNMC, Dr. Davies served as professor and chair of the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine Pediatrics and Human Development Department. Before that, he was director of the Child Health Research Unit at Alberta Children's Hospital in Calgary, Canada, and the Child Health Research Institute at the University of Calgary.

Dr. Davies has received numerous prestigious awards during his career for his research, teaching, mentorship and community service. Since 2006, he has been recognized annually as a member of the Best Doctors of America, is a fellow of both the Infectious Diseases Society of America and Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society, and a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha National Honor Medical Society, the Society for Pediatric Research and the American Pediatric Society.

Dr. Davies has more than 250 publications in peer-reviewed journals related to his research on infectious diseases topics, several book chapters and other scholarly publications, and numerous presentations at national and international meetings.

Dr. Davies earned his medical degree from the University of Toronto Temerty Faculty of Medicine and a master's degree in epidemiology from the University of Toronto Dana Lana School of Public Health. Dr. Davies also holds a master's degree in health care management from the Harvard School of Public Health. He is specialty-trained in pediatrics and pediatric infectious diseases from the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto.

Dr. Davies has conducted research and developed health pipeline programs that have been supported by over \$24 million in funding either as principal investigator, co-principal investigator or co-investigator from several agencies including the National Institutes of Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the Alberta Heritage Foundation for Medical Research and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. Dr. Davies was named as one of the top 2% researchers in his field based on citation metrics by a 2022 Stanford University Study.

Clinical Perfusion

Clinical Perfusionists run a complicated machine that works like a person's heart and lungs. This keeps a person alive while their heart is stopped for open-heart surgery. The perfusionist also runs equipment that saves and cleans blood during operations. The program is 21 months, leading to a Master of Perfusion Science degree.

Diagnostic Cytology

Cytologists perform microscopic examinations of specially stained slides of human cells from sites throughout the body for the early diagnosis and treatment of disease. The program is 16 months, leading to a Master of Diagnostic Cytology degree.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography

Sonographers use sophisticated equipment that directs high frequency sound waves (ultrasound) into areas of a patient's body to generate images for diagnostic purposes. The program is 12 months, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging & Therapeutic Sciences degree or Post-Baccalaureate Professional Certificate in Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

The program is nine months, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging & Therapeutic Sciences degree or Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Magnetic Resonance Imaging.

Medical Laboratory Science

The program is 11 months, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Science degree. The MLS program starts in May each year, and as such, students have already arrived at their clinical sites.
