College of Allied Health Professions Evidence-Based Healthcare Forum

The Research Development and Management Committee of the College of Allied Health Professions (CAHP) is again sponsoring an Evidence-Based Healthcare Forum. This forum will consist of digital poster presentations with small group discussion of **research projects**, **critical reviews** of literature, or **educational exhibits** by students in the CAHP programs. The Healthcare Forum is **Wednesday, May 4, 2022**.

Registration instructions are as follows:

1. **One** student from each group presenting a digital poster must fill out the **registration form** on the [Forum website](#). Registration requires only the title, authors, program, and topic area. The title should clearly indicate the nature of the work. Registration is due **NO LATER** than Friday, March 11, 2022 @ 11:59 pm CST.
2. You will receive additional information from your program designee (see below) regarding completion and submission of your abstract and poster.

3. Write content in **third person** unless quoting a survey question. Limit content to **350 words**.
4. The content of the abstract should include and clearly state:
 - a. objective of the research, review, or educational exhibit
 - b. sufficient information to demonstrate clinical relevance
 - c. methodology as relevant
 - d. results as relevant; sufficient information to support conclusions
 - e. conclusions

You may receive more specific instructions from your program.

GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS
College of Allied Health Professions Evidence-Based Healthcare Forum

1. A typical hard copy poster must be readable at a distance of 5 feet or more. Word 18 - 20 point is a minimally appropriate font size. Include the **UNMC emblem and system logo and brand approved colors** on your poster as per branding instructions (<https://brandwise.unmc.edu/>). Branded poster templates are available at the UNMC brand website, as well. Please contact Fran Higgins (fhiggins@unmc.edu) if you have questions regarding branding.
2. Some simple rules in organizing your poster will greatly aid its readability:
 - a. For the research poster, stay clearly organized as to:
 1. Abstract
 2. Purpose
 3. Introduction
 4. Methods
 5. Data Presentation
 6. Conclusion (expressed as a summary with interpretation and clinical implication).
 7. References (may be in smaller font; use a consistent format; relate to text of poster)
 - b. For the critical review and educational exhibit posters, stay clearly organized as to:
 1. Abstract
 2. Topic/hypothesis to be addressed
 3. Introduction: sufficient information to demonstrate relevance to the allied health professions.
 4. Information from studies reviewed, implications to allied health professions.
 5. Summary or conclusion
 6. Very brief list of references used/reviewed.
3. Details about the presentation structure and process are posted on the Forum website (link website). Please review these instructions to ensure that your presentation is in the correct format and includes the required information.

FOLLOWING THE GUIDELINES WILL ENSURE A PRODUCTIVE, INFORMAL SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION. TAKE PRIDE IN YOUR POSTER PRESENTATION. IT REPRESENTS THE QUALITY OF YOUR PROGRAM.
