

Project PEACE Part 2: Psychiatric Emergencies

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION

This course offers a comprehensive approach to managing psychiatric emergencies, focusing on both identification and treatment. In the first module, you will learn how to recognize and manage critical situations involving suicidal, agitated, and violent patients, including a review of the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale (C-SSRS). The second module will expand on this knowledge, providing an in-depth look at treatment options and specialized cases, equipping you with the skills to effectively handle a range of psychiatric emergencies.

TARGET AUDIENCE
