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Nebraska Trauma System of Care - Why

Need for Trauma System of Care:

- Unintentional Injuries:
 - Leading causes of death: poisoning (e.g., drug overdoses), motor vehicle traffic, drowning, and falls
 - ▶ Leading cause of death in 1 44 age group
 - Increase in death rates from falls after age 65
- Injury deaths account 60.3 death per 100,000 of population in 2019
- \$2,033,763,267 inpatient hospital charges for unintentional injury hospitalizations in 2019.

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Nebraska Trauma System History

- Statewide Trauma System Act
 - ▶ LB 626 passed in 1997 Trauma System Plan
 - Rules and Regulations were stopped 1999
- Funding
 - LB 191 passed in 2001
 - Emergency Medical Systems Cash Fund
 - AKA Fifty Cents for Life
- Trauma System of Care Regulations finally passed 2002
- Advance Trauma Life Support (ATLS) 35 years ago




Nebraska 53 Designated Trauma Centers

- 3 Level II Advance Trauma Centers (One ACS Verified).
- 1 Level II Specialty Pediatric Center (ACS Verified)
- 6 Level III General Trauma Centers (One ACS Verified)
- 41 Level IV Basic Trauma Centers
 - * 62 Critical Access Hospitals and 27 Acute Hospitals




2023 Level 1 and 2 Trauma Incidents

2025 Trauma Program Projects

- Title 185 NAC 1 NE Trauma Regulation Revisions
- Revision of the trauma data dictionary
- NE Hospitals, Designation, Re-designations and consultations ongoing (53 hospitals currently designated)
- Starting to review data OEHS Epidemiologist



Trauma Regulation Revisions

- Fixing typos and formatting.
 - Moved all education to separate section
- Significant Changes:
 - Added minimum staffing for facility being reviewed to on-site review
 - Added pediatric specific requirements for pediatric readiness



Trauma Regulation Revisions Cont.

- Significant Changes:
 - Clarified:
 - Performance improvement program plan
 - Added elements of a performance improvement program
 - Added methods of a performance improvement program
 - Multi-disciplinary system/operations
 - Trauma peer review committee
 - Changed requirement for ophthalmologic surgery to available within 30 minutes, 24 hours a day OR a written contingency plan with 100% performance improvement review.

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Trauma Registry Data

- Designated trauma centers must be reported monthly
- 90-days post trauma patient discharge
- Monthly reminder for those facilities that are behind in reporting data
- Required to use trauma registry for statistical reports to address PI and performance improvement.
- Software Vendor = ImageTrend
 - Working with ImageTrend for ESO imports

Rural Trauma Team Development Course (RTTDC)

- Organize a rural trauma team with defined roles and responsibilities for the members
- Prepare a rural facility for the appropriate care of the injured patient identify local resources and limitations
- Assess and resuscitate a trauma patient Initiate the transfer process early
- Establish a performance improvement process
- Encourage effective communication
- Define the relationship between the rural trauma facility and the regional trauma system
