The voting meetings for the Early Decision Program were held in September 2022. A total of 39 applicants to the Early Decision Program were reviewed: 21 were accepted and 18 applicants were deferred to the regular applicant pool. Voting meetings for the regular applicant pool began in November 2022. There were 2,073 AMCAS applications received for the 2022-2023 cycle. A total of 378 applicants were invited for an interview. There were 171 applicants accepted to the 2023 entering medical school class. After withdrawals, the total number of new applicants who applied in the 2022-2023 cycle set to matriculate is currently 131.

The Committee reviewed and accepted two applicants to the oral surgery program. These students joined the third-year class when clinical rotations began in April 2023.

The Admissions Committee met on June 28, 2023, to discuss policies and procedures for the upcoming season. The committee voted by majority to approve UNMC's diversity categories after Drs. Britigan and Delair reviewed the categories with the committee. All new members will complete implicit bias training and individual training regarding interviewing, file review and the Admissions Committee review process. Current members who have not completed implicit bias training in the last 3 years will be required to complete this training again. The Committee approved by majority the supplemental application questions for the 2023-2024 cycle. A full review of the existing policy and procedure manual will be completed by Drs. Amy Beethe. The Policy and Procedures manual will be reviewed by the Committee and new members. Applicant files will continue to be available for review by a secure electronic link for the 2023-2024 application cycle.

For interviewed applicants who were unsuccessful in admission, the Admissions Office offered the opportunity to meet to discuss their application. The office completed 82 "application review" appointments with applicants who were not accepted during the 2022-2023 cycle. The Admissions Office also provided review appointments for applicants who were residents or non-residents that were not selected to interview due to the competitiveness of their application. The office completed 43 advising appointments with applicants who were not interviewed during the 2022-2023 cycle.
