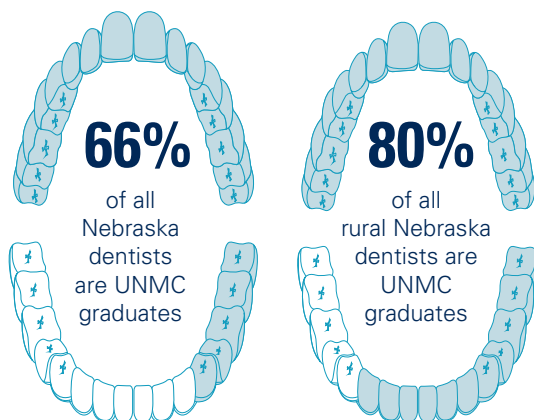

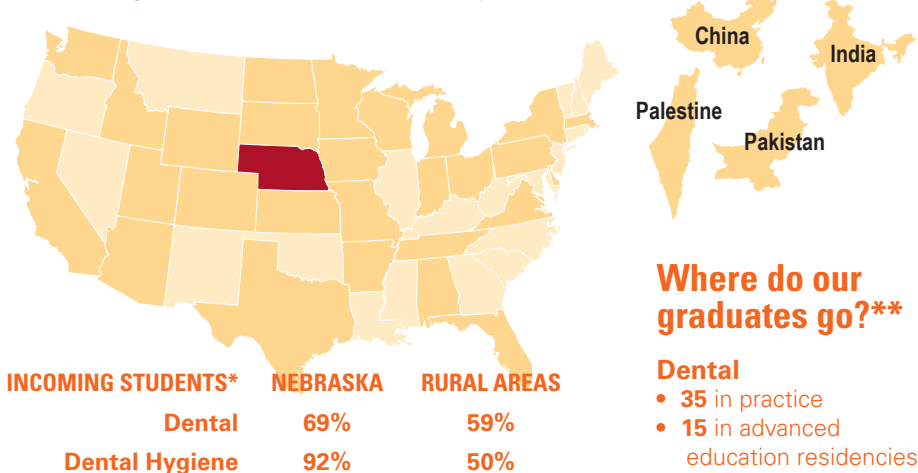

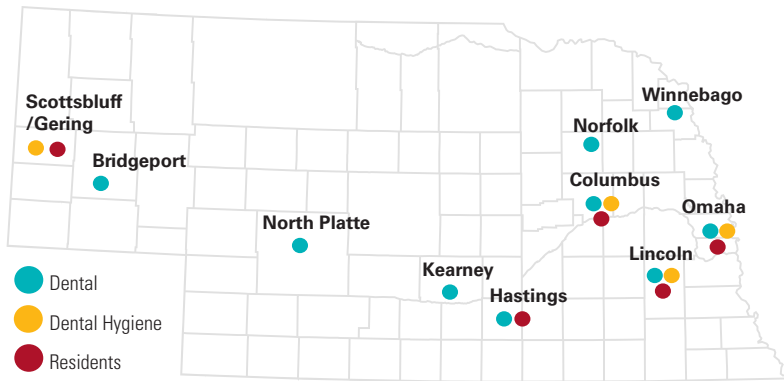
### SCHOLARSHIPS

The College of Dentistry provided more than **\$149,000** in scholarship aid from private contributions.

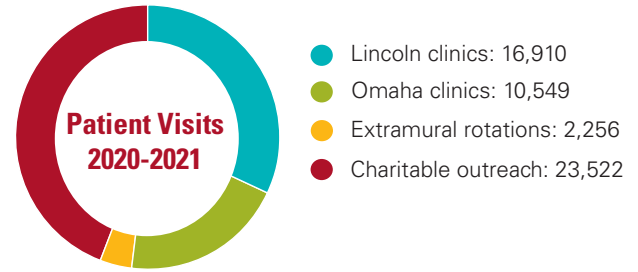

The College of Dentistry forms part of the dental "safety net" for the state of Nebraska, conducting **more than 53,000 patient visits**.



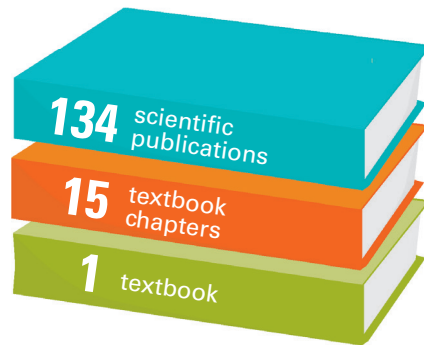

Over the past 5 years, College of Dentistry faculty and staff members have authored:

extramural research support in 2020-2021

Areas of research supported by this funding: studies on cell signaling in skin biology, palatal fusion, oral and other cancers; dental materials research; digital dentistry; DNA damage and repair in cancer biology; treatment of periodontal disease; teledentistry in rural health; and oral health training and service.
