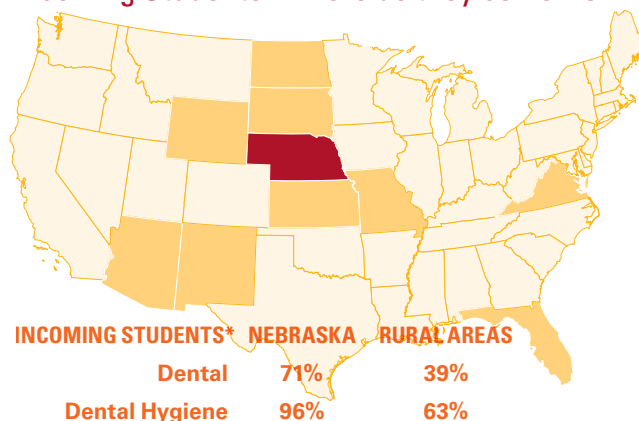

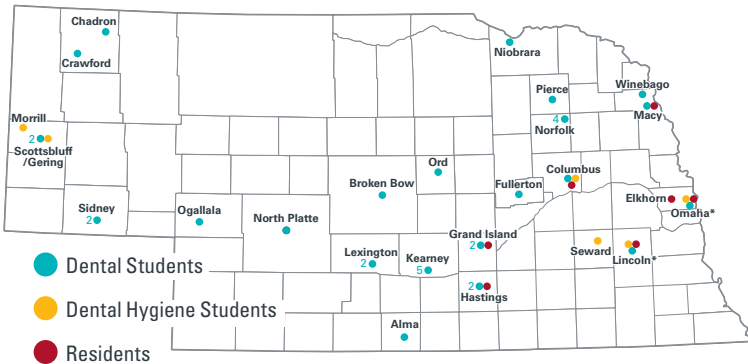

- Charitable outreach: 3,390



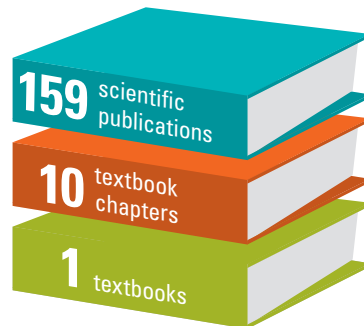
