

Another year has come and gone in the Department of Surgical Specialties here at the University of Nebraska Medical Center College of Dentistry. Among the more notable events was the announcement that our current dean, **Dr. John Reinhardt,** would retire after 14 years. Just recently, his successor, **Dr. Janet Guthmiller,** was named. She is a board-certified periodontist who got her DDS at lowa and her perio at University of Texas San Antonio. We are looking forward

to her start in September, 2014. It remains to be seen whether I shall continue my occasional periodontist joke, as my new boss is, indeed one.

We've had another successful year here in the department, with the commonly-used metrics, publications, grants, and CE courses, listed in the following pages. **Dr. Ebke** and I did utilize one of our favorite technological upgrades, the Sim-Man simulator, to put on a successful "hands-on" medical emergency course this fall. We are planning to do another one the day before a home football game in the fall of 2014, and are in the process of developing a more advanced course for those emergencies that might be involved with the provision of parenteral sedation.




Chair Bavitz

We were happy to fill her position with another winner, **Megan Christiansen.** Megan graduated from our hygiene program in 1994 and will help the department with patient care, teaching, and research. Our residents continue to come and go. I am always very impressed with the quality of people that we attract here to Nebraska, and I am also impressed and grateful for the support our alums offer to the department, both in their donated time and their financial support. As always, our development funds are used to support resident level research and travel; I'm not sure what we would do without the continued contributions many of you have made.

One of the more recent challenges here at the college is the acquisition of enough quality patients, especially so for our undergraduate endodontic and periodontic sections. One solution, which seems to be working reasonably well, is rotating students to some of the local public health clinics. **Dr. Hany Makkawy** is spearheading the efforts in endodontics, and part-time faculty, **Dr. Van Sanderfer,** assuming the responsibility for periodontics. This trend to rotate dental students outside of the college is occurring nationwide with students spending less time in the college. Our residents continue to rotate to the VA hospital in Lincoln, and there is a possibility of an increased presence at the Omaha VA. Stay tuned for further details on this.

Dr. Jeffrey Gold was appointed UNMC chancellor by the president of the university just three months ago. 

practice on the weekends. He is married to Chelsea and they have three children: Dax, Barrett and Meyers.




Upon completion of the program, Cody will be entering private practice in Sioux City, Iowa.
