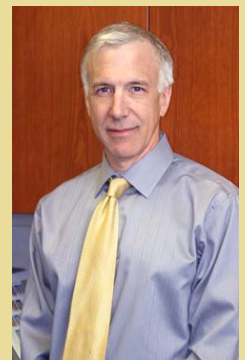

The Chair Report

Thank you for inspecting this edition of the Newsletter from the Department of Surgical Specialties at the University of Nebraska Medical Center College of Dentistry.

At the top of my list of things to do for 2012 was to recruit and hire a new full-time endodontic faculty member, and after a rigorous national search, we are pleased to have "signed" **Dr. Lane Stephenson**. He has already made a positive impact teaching our undergraduate and graduate students; this should be of no great surprise as he graduated from our endodontic residency program in 1994. His diverse private practice experience has been an asset, as is his affable nature, and overall we couldn't be more pleased. I believe this is the first time in the history of the college that we have had three full-time endodontists, especially impressive as the state's funding to the university slowly dwindles. It is certainly plausible that the practice of mock emergencies on our SimMan can significantly improve outcomes and possibly even save a life in the advent of a medical emergency in the dental office.

Finally, I would be remiss if I did not mention something about the financial and scholarly contributions of our alums, many of whom have donated both money and their time/expertise teaching within the department. 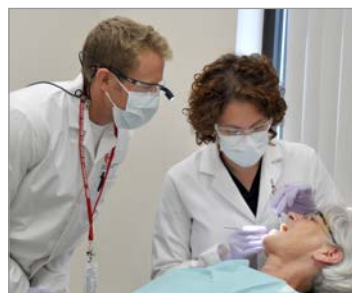

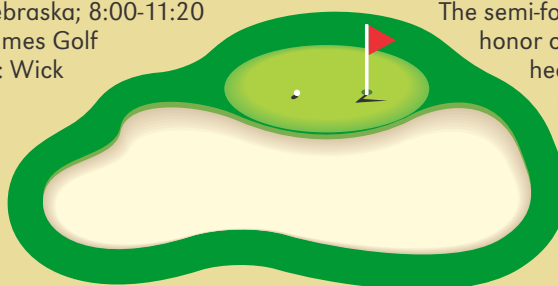
