Village Pointe Dermatology Opens its Doors!

The time has finally come for our Village Pointe location to open and for us to welcome our patients at our new location! It is wild to think that we have reached the finish line! This building has been years in the making, so we are incredibly excited that the time has finally come to use the space. With this new location, Dermatology has been able to expand our comprehensive dermatologic care to another area at Nebraska Medicine. We will maintain our Lauritzen Outpatient Center site along with a few satellite locations, including Westroads, Chalco, and the Specialty Care Clinic, in addition to this new Village Pointe site. This expansion offers many specialty clinic options and light therapy every day of the week. This location will also provide our patients with excellent Mohs surgery and vein programs. As we expand, we aim to bring as many of our specialty clinics and programs to these new locations as possible to increase access to dermatologic care across the Omaha metro area.

On Wednesday, June 21st, the organization held a ribbon cutting and open house to celebrate the new building. During this event, there were members of organizational leadership,

including our Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Jim Linder, our Chief Operating Officer, Dr. Michael Ash, and Vice President of Operations, Tom Macy, who discussed how important this building will be for the expansion of ambulatory and to bring new specialties to the west Omaha area. Jay Noddle was also present to represent the team who helped to fund this building. Last but certainly not least, there were members of the clinical and physician groups present to represent the staff who would be occupying the space. Dr. Jill Poole spoke on behalf of the providers, echoing her excitement about the new space and how this expansion will help bring new specialties to this area and expand some of our current specialties. Dermatology was fortunate enough to be one of two specialties selected to have a representative help in the ribbon cutting to represent all the team members who helped to prepare and will continue to work in this space. Suzie Weiss, BSN, RN, was selected as Dermatology's representative and did a fantastic job representing our entire staff; she has worked tirelessly to ensure we are prepared to see patients in this building. Suzie is a nurse on our surgical team and has been innovative throughout this transition, thinking through details

Many team members stopped by the open house to see the stunning space, and we were happy to have people see the space come to fruition finally. Open Door Mission Cards- 1.4.2023-1.31.2023

Founded in 1954, Open Door Mission is a Gospel rescue Mission committed to breaking the cycle of homelessness and poverty throughout the Omaha area. To date they have provided 157,195 nights of shelter, served 1.42 million meals, and helped 528 patients experiencing homelessness receive treatment. As part of an effort to curb the stress and depression many individuals facing homelessness have, UNMC volunteered their time to create motivational cards in support of their cause. The 37 cards created by the Dermatology department were filled with uplifting messages and well wishes aimed at providing empowering individuals through tough times.

Kicks for a Cure- 4.15.2023

Envisioned by Dave Karnes in 2004, Kicks for a Cure has raised over \$4.1 million dollars for cancer research. Though its primary purpose is to raise awareness for cancer education and prevention, KFAC has also helped encourage people to live healthy and active lifestyles. As part of the fundraising event held in April, UNMC Department of Dermatology joined participants on the field to promote sun safety by providing sunscreen, UV Patches, educational brochures, and awareness bracelets.



Mexican Consulate Skin Exam- 4.15.2023

The Mexican Consulate provides

consular protection and assistance with immigration, human rights, emergencies, educational opportunities, health guidance, criminal, administrative, work and family matters. As part of their effort to provide accessible health services to the migrant community in Omaha, UNMC conducted free skin exams and medical consultation to participants.

Minority Health Month Fair- 4.29.2023



Every April, the U.S. Department of Health, and Human Services (HHS) Office of Minority Health (OMH) observes National Minority Health Month to highlight the importance of improving the health of racial and ethnic minority and American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) communities and reducing health disparities. This year the focus was on improving health outcomes for racial and ethnic communities by providing free health services and educational opportunities to nurture healthier outcomes in the community. UNMC participated in this endeavor by offering free skin examinations and handing out sunscreen and educational pamphlets highlighting the importance of sun safety. In total, 17 participants received care.

Cattleman's Ball- 6.3.2023

The Cattlemen's Ball of Nebraska is a charity whose mission is to raise money for cancer research through an annual fundraising event. Money raised during this event is used to further cancer research at the Fred & Pamela Buffett Cancer Center in Omaha Nebraska. UNMC Department of Dermatology participated in this cause by providing

educational pamphlets highlighting the importance of sun safety as well as handing out sunscreen, UV patches, and bracelets to all those who attended. In total, 325 participants came and visited the UNMC booth this year.

College World Series- 6.25.2023

The College World Series, officially the NCAA Men's College World Series, is an annual baseball tournament held in June in Omaha, Nebraska. This year's MCWS saw attendance rates skyrocket attracting 392,946 attendees throughout its 16 sessions the highest number of fans in a single year. Throughout it all UNMC Department of Dermatology joined the NCAA in promoting importance of sun safety through educational pamphlets, providing sunscreen and UV patches, and handing out bracelets to fans. UNMC gave away 2,246 items to help fans stay safe and enjoy the games.

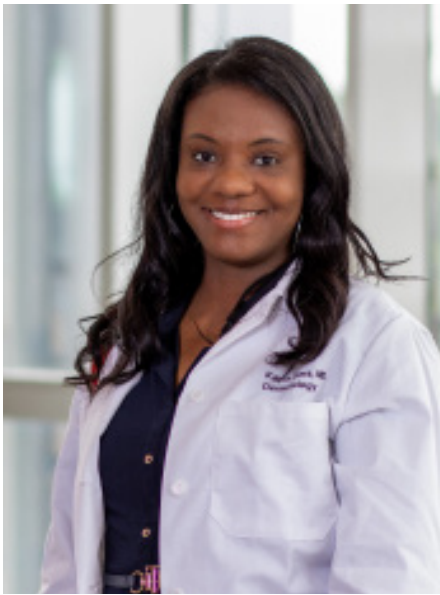

Assistant Professor

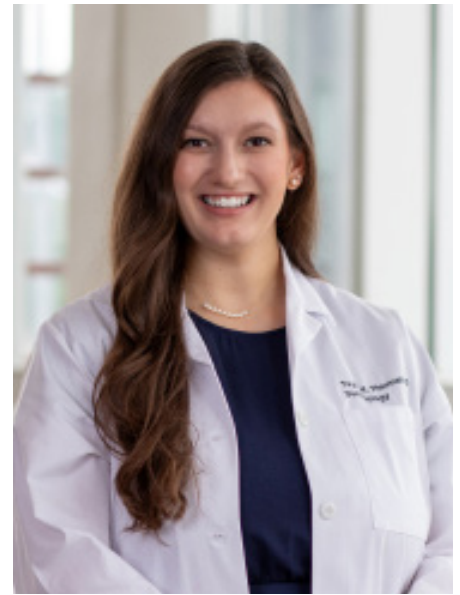
