

Rural Emergency Medicine Course May 8th – 10th, 2024

The Rural Emergency Medicine Course is designed for physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners to review low-frequency, high-risk emergencies and practice lifesaving procedures in a realistic, controlled teaching environment. Procedure-based learning will feature cadavers (subject to availability), simulation, and task trainers and include advanced airway management, surgical airways, splinting, intraosseous access, chest tubes, intimate partner violence recognition and treatment, code simulations, neonatal procedures, and ultrasound training.

The goal of this course is to offer diverse learning opportunities related to both adult and pediatric emergencies.
