Bangladesh Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Minister visits UNMC



Seven delegates led by the Honorable Minister Zahid Maleque of the Bangladesh Ministry of Health and Family Welfare visited the UNMC on Dec. 19-20. The trip centered around opportunities for bilateral collaboration between the University of Nebraska Medical Center and the Ministry in establishing a national cancer program, a national organ transplant program, a vaccine research and development program, and health security and biopreparedness. The delegation also discussed education and training opportunities with College of Public Health leadership. A Memorandum of Understanding was also signed during their visit.

Student Alliance for Global Health holds adult diaper drive for Ukraine

In October and early November, the Student Alliance for Global Health (SAGH) organized an adult diaper collection to benefit the medical relief efforts in Ukraine. In consultation with Olga Taraschenko, MD, PhD, associate professor, department of neurological sciences and Valentina Gumenyuk, PhD, assistant professor, department of neurological sciences, along with Viktoriya Mashinson, College of Pharmacy doctoral student and SAGH board member, SAGH focused on the collection of adult diapers at the request of a Ukranian physician working with immobile adults in Kharkiv.

The Omaha campus, as well as the College of Dentistry in Lincoln participated in the drive. In addition to the adult diapers collected from these locations, SAGH received a generous donation from the family of DJ Thayer, director, international and domestic business affairs in the Office of Global Engagement, after the recent death of DJ's father.

The collected diapers will be shipped with other medical supplies to Ukraine in early January. SAGH extends heartfelt thanks to the UNMC community for its support of this collection drive.
