**Course Dates:** February 2020

**Course Description:** This four-week course is an immersion into the India health-care system with onsite exposure to oncologic surgical care at various hospitals in the city of Hyderabad, Telangana, India and other hospitals in the states of Telangana and Andhra. The focus of the rotation is two-fold. One being the intra-operative experience with exposure to a myriad of oncologic surgical procedures including, but not limited to, neurosurgery head and neck, breast, pulmonary/thoracic, hepatopancreaticobiliary (HPB), gynecologic, urologic and colorectal. Second, students will also have time available for additional travel and cultural experiences as a means of developing a broader and global perspective of health care and human beings critical for physicians-in-training.
