## Ray H. Frohn Incoming Graduate Student Scholarship

### Scholarship Duration and Amount:

1. For scholarship candidates applying for UNMC graduate school admission in the Summer 2022, Fall 2022, or Spring 2023 terms, the amount of the scholarship will be \$5,000.
2. The top tier of scholarship awards will provide \$5,000 for *two* consecutive years (contingent on successful renewal of the scholarship for the second year, as described below in “Eligibility Criteria”).
3. The second tier of scholarship awards will provide \$5,000 for *one* academic year.
4. Scholarship payments will be distributed on a monthly basis, with the following starting dates (depending on the student’s starting term): Summer 2022: July 1; Fall 2022: August 1; Spring 2023: January 1. Scholarships will be prorated and end on June 30, 2023 (for one-year scholarship recipients) or on June 30, 2024 (for two-year scholarship recipients).

### Eligibility Criteria:

1. The applicant must have a minimum of a 4-year Bachelor’s degree from a U.S. educational institution, or an equivalent degree from an educational institution in another country, with a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 based on a four-point scale.
2. The applicant must have received an offer of acceptance as a full-time student from a UNMC graduate program. Acceptance of the offer is not a prerequisite for applying for the scholarship. Only new applicants/incoming students will be eligible to apply for this scholarship (not current students).
3. Applicants can have an offer of acceptance either from a PhD or a Masters program at UNMC, although PhD applicants will be preferred.
4. Applicants must fit Category A and/or Category B.  
*Category A:* the applicant is someone who can contribute diverse cultural experiences or background or special talents that will lead to a richer and more diverse UNMC campus environment and that can be evaluated on an individual basis.  
*Category B:* the applicant has a demonstrated track record of commitment to the service of underserved communities and/or patients.
5. For students awarded a top-tier scholarship (i.e., one with potential renewal for a second year), the renewal for the second year will be contingent upon having a UNMC GPA of at least 3.0 on July 1, 2023.

**Application:** The applicant should submit the Ray H. Frohn Incoming Graduate Student Scholarship application form, along with one or both of the statements described below, via email directly to the faculty director of the graduate program from which the applicant has an offer of acceptance. (If the applicant does not know the email address for the faculty director of that graduate program, it can be obtained by contacting the Graduate Studies Office at [unmcgraduatestudies@unmc.edu](mailto:unmcgraduatestudies@unmc.edu).) The applicant’s name, email address, and phone number should be included at the top of each statement. For each statement, the minimum length is 1 paragraph and the maximum length is 500 words.

1. A statement explaining how the applicant will contribute diverse cultural experiences or background or special talents that would lead to a richer and more diverse UNMC campus environment.
2. A statement explaining the applicant’s track record of commitment to the service of underserved communities and/or patients.

If both statements are submitted, it may increase the applicant’s chance of receiving scholarship support.

Awards for this scholarship will be made on a rolling basis and only 10 awards will be given during Summer 2022/ Fall 2022/Spring 2023, so applications should be submitted as early as possible.
