## Ray H. Frohn Incoming Graduate Student Scholarship

### Scholarship Amount and Duration:

1. For scholarship candidates offered admittance to UNMC graduate school in the Summer 2026, Fall 2026, or Spring 2027 terms, the amount of the scholarship will be \$5,000 per year for a maximum of two consecutive years.
2. The second year of funding is contingent on maintaining enrollment as a full-time student and having a UNMC GPA of at least 3.0 at 12 months after matriculation.

### Criteria for Eligibility:

1. The applicant must have a minimum of a 4-year Bachelor's degree from a U.S. educational institution, or an equivalent degree from an educational institution in another country, with a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 based on a four-point scale.
2. The applicant must have received an offer of admission as a full-time student from a degree program administered by UNMC Graduate Studies. Acceptance of the admission offer is not a prerequisite for applying for the scholarship. Only new applicants/incoming students will be eligible to apply for this scholarship (not current UNMC students who have already matriculated).
3. Applicants can have an offer of acceptance either from a PhD or a Masters program at UNMC, although PhD applicants will be preferred in the selection of scholarship recipients.
4. Applicants must fit Category A and/or Category B.  
*Category A:* the applicant is someone who brings experiences, background, or special talents that will lead to a richer UNMC campus environment and can be evaluated on an individual basis  
*Category B:* the applicant has a demonstrated track record of commitment to serving communities and/or patients in need.

**Application:** The applicant should submit the Ray H. Frohn Incoming Graduate Student Scholarship application form, along with one or both of the statements described below, via email directly to the faculty director of the graduate program from which the applicant has an offer of acceptance. (If the applicant does not know the email address for the faculty director of that graduate program, it can be obtained by contacting the Graduate Studies Office at [unmcgraduatestudies@unmc.edu](mailto:unmcgraduatestudies@unmc.edu).) The applicant's name, email address, and phone number should be included at the top of each submitted statement. For each statement, the minimum length is 1 paragraph and the maximum length is 500 words.

1. A statement explaining how the applicant will contribute to a richer UNMC campus environment.
2. A statement explaining the applicant's track record of commitment to the service of communities and/or patients in need.

If both statements are submitted, it may increase the applicant's chance of receiving scholarship support.

Awards for this scholarship will be made on a rolling basis and only five awards will be given during Summer 2026/Fall 2026/Spring 2027, so applications should be submitted as early as possible.
