




Data update as of 02nd November 2022 at 22:00 HRS



Background

On 20th September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus (SVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This followed investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus

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Two newly confirmed deaths in the past 24 Figure 1: Time analysis of affected individuals by affected district hours – both from Mubende ETU.

- Five new recoveries in the past 24 hours, bringing cumulative recoveries to 54.
- Case Fatality Ratio (CFR) among confirmed cases is 48/131 (37%).
- A total of 1,604 contacts actively being followed-up in eight districts, follow-up rate in the past 24 hours was 93%.

Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:

Contact tracing

- Daily DTF and IMT-specific meetings within all affected districts; NTF scheduled thrice a week.
- Total contacts under follow up within the past 24-hours are 1,604 within eight districts. Follow up rate for contacts is at 93%
- Total alerts validated within the past 24-hours were 95, of which 34 met the suspected case definition and 26 were evacuated.
- Team Kyegegwa continued engaging locals in Kibuba village to further understand the source of infection for the most recent confirmed case.
- The surveillance teams continue to investigate new cases to define chains of transmission for the new case reported in the last 48 hours
- A total of 26 alerts received from 19 category #2, #3 districts: Agago (01), Amuru (01), Busia (01), Gomba (01), Ibanda (01), Kabarole (01), Kakumiro (04), Kasese (02), Katakwi (01), Kayunga (01), Kiboga (01), Kyankwanzi (01), Kyenjojo (02), Masaka (01), Mpigi (03), Ntoroko (01), Omoro (01), Oyam (01), Zombo (01). All tested NEGATIVE for EVD (SUD)

- Plans underway to establish ETU at Kalwana COU, and a holding centre at Bweyongedde in Kassanda.
- A total of 29 evacuations done in Mubende and 35 in Kassanda.
- Onducted four safe and dignified burials in Mubende and Kassanda within the past 24 hours.
- Three backlog case in the past 24 hours two alerts received past 18:00 hrs, one family was not yet ready.
- Provided technical guidance on the waste management in Mubende ETU.
- IPC onsite mentorship and scorecard assessment with mentors in 7 public and private facilities in Kasambya, action points drawn according to gaps identified.
- Conducted a quality check of the available coveralls in the Mubende ETU and resolved on using the one that is user friendly and of the recommended quality.
- Conducted a rapid assessment for Kyegegwa IPC requirements
- Installation of water tanks in Madudu HCIII
- Handwashing facilities provided in Kibuuba village for the community and in three schools.
- Two radio talk shows conducted in Kassanda and Kagadi.
- A total of 44 radio spots messages continue to be aired through five radio stations in Mubende; 29 in Kassanda, 29 in Kagadi and Kakumiro and 12 in Buyangabu.
- Up to 120 IEC posters disseminated in Mpefu sub-county in Kagadi, 60 in Kyegegwa and 146 in Bunyangabu.
- Ocmmunity volunteers and VHTs conducted house to house mobilization and sensitization in five districts where 937 households were visited and reached 13,215 (11,774 males, 4,774 females) with EVD prevention messages.
- RCCE team engaged residents of Rutooma village, Mpefu sub-county in Kagadi district on the prevention of EVD and reached 38 people (27Males, 9 Females).
- A total of 3,716 (1,648 males, 2,068 females) pupils and 39 males, 22 females) teachers reached with EVD messages in districts of Bunyangabu and Mubende.
- Nine police officers (6 males & 3 females) in Rwimi reached with EVD messages in Bunyangabu.
- One community meeting conducted in Kasule sub-county in Kyegegwa together with RDC, LCV chairperson and RCCE team where 250 (117 females, 93 males and 40 children were sensitized on EVD.
- Community engagement meeting with community of Kibuuba village in Kyegegwa where 117 females, 93 males and 40 children were engaged.
- MoH national Call Centre handled 366 incoming calls related to Ebola of which 215 were viable and were responded to. U-Report received 120 messages on Ebola.
- Stassanda got information about people displaced from a forest reserve in Kiboga and settled itself in Rwenyange but have relatives in Kikandwa and Karwana frequent these areas to collect food. They do not believe that there is Ebola.
- Family members are continually updated about status of their loved-ones in the ETUs
- Supportive counseling offered to six confirmed clients at Mubende ETU amd four suspected clients at Madudu ETU.
- Psychosocial education conducted in Mukondo and Itambabiniga zones of Kyegegwa, reaching 174 refugees; 1,896 persons in Kyaka 2 were sensitized on EVD prevention
- Eight discharged survivors and 13 clients discharged from the Mubende ETU annex escorted back home after community engagement; 13 clients from emergency ward re-united with families.

Key messages to the public

- People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhoea or urine, bleeding from body openings).
