

## Nebraska DHHS HIV Program Overview

#### **FUNDING** (100% federally-funded)

- PS24-0047 (High-Impact HIV Prevention & Surveillance Programs)
  - Year 2 June 1, 2025, through May 31, 2026
    - Notice of Award (NOA) issued on July 1, 2025
      - Prevention: \$1,088,850
      - Surveillance: \$290,337
- Preventive Health & Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG)
  - October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026
    - \$130,000



## Nebraska DHHS HIV Program Overview

- HIV prevention education and outreach
- HIV Counseling, Testing, and Referral support
- HIV surveillance
- Disease intervention
- Linkage-to-Care
- Technical assistance







## **Collaboration and Partnerships**

NE DHHS collaborates with local health agencies to secure funding, testing resources, educational materials, and healthcare services for individuals who cannot afford them. 

## **Syndemic Approach**

Syndemic care emphasizes the interconnectedness of various social, psychological, and physical factors that impact an individual's health. When it comes to sexual health, considering the broader context is crucial. By understanding the complex interplay of these factors, syndemic care supports a holistic approach to improving sexual health, addressing not just the physical but also the social, mental, and environmental determinants that shape health outcomes.





## Syndemic Approach

#### **Substance Use**

- Alcohol and drug use can impair judgment, leading to risky sexual behavior (e.g., condomless sex, multiple partners).
- Chronic substance use can interfere with access to care, treatment, and support, as well as complicate the management of sexual health issues.
- Substance use is often tied to social factors like homelessness or poverty, which further exacerbate sexual health risks.

#### **Social and Economic Factors**

- Poverty and financial insecurity limit access to health care, contraception, or sexual health services, leading to increased risk of negative sexual health outcomes.
- Structural inequalities, such as lack of access to education, employment, or healthcare, disproportionately affect marginalized groups, leading to higher rates of STIs and other sexual health concerns.



- HIV Testing at CTR Sites
  - January June 2025 3,120 tests administered, 11 reactive tests

## Same-Day PrEP Pilot Program

#### **PrEP Screening at CTR Sites**

- Screened for PrEP referral
  - 2,691 (86.6%)
- Eligible for PrEP referral
  - 1,706 (54.9%)
- Referred for PrEP
  - 1,385 (44.6%)
