DEMENTIA IN LONG-TERM CARE DRESSING TIP SHEETS

- 1. Make sure appropriate and seasonal selections are available for the resident.
- 2. Have the resident help with dressing, using a slow, step-by-step approach.
- 3. Simple comfortable clothing, in line with their personal preferences, will be the best choice for resident attire.
- 4. Make sure clothing is clean, undamaged, and unwrinkled. Alert family immediately to damaged or lost clothing.
- 5. Minimize buttons, zippers, and fasteners to assist the resident in dressing and undressing.
- 6. For residents who wear the closest items available remove their worn clothing items daily and replace them with one outfit.
- 7. Fewer selections in their closet make the resident less overwhelmed with selecting.
- 8. Laying out clothing daily limits anxiety and allows the resident to remain in control of their dressing.
- 9. Hand the resident an item at a time, name the item and remind them where and how it fits on their body.
- 10. If the same outfit is chosen all the time, then have the family purchase this same ensemble for repeated wearing.
