

A COMPLETE MEDICAL CENTER SPECIFICALLY FOR CHILDREN




This is an aerial view of the Children's Medical Center in Omaha. The corresponding numbers show the location of each facility in this Center.

Children's Memorial Hospital provides all specialized pediatric acute hospital procedures. The Emergency **Department and the Master Poison** Control and Treatment Center operate twenty-four hours a day. The Cleft-Lip, Cleft-Palate, and Birth Defect Clinics are under the direction of outstanding specialists. Available for all children are private rooms, group care, and infant care departments. The medical staff includes the outstanding men in all areas of medicine, surgery, pathology and radiology.



The Children's Division of The Nebraska Psychiatric Institute provides comprehensive consultative and treatment services for both emotionally sick and mentally retarded children. Its facilities, which are among the most complete in the country, include: Inpatient, outpatient, day patient services, psychiatric nursery, neurological research ward, Carl and Caroline Swanson Children's Clinic, clinical research center for mental retardation.



C. Louis Meyer Therapy Center provides diagnostic and treatment facilities for handicapped children referred by a medical practitioner. Services include medical evaluation with specialty consultation, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech and hearing therapy, psychological testing and counselling and medical social service. All are under active medical direction assisted by a consulting specialty medical staff. Because of the wide variance in physical and mental development, the age of the children may range from six months to twenty-one years.




The Omaha Hearing School is staffed by full time trained teachers of the deaf. Its purpose is to act as a central service for diagnosis of speech and auditory problems for pre-school children and prepare them for entrance into a regular school for the deaf or into a school with hearing children. Admission is by medical referral from family physician, pediatrician or otologist.



The Children's Sight Center is a pre-school for the blind or near blind child. The Center's program extends over a wide field of child training and instruction, from the fundamentals of self feeding, dressing, hygiene, speech development, to general preparation for kindergarten.

This nursery school is a non-profit, non-sectarian organization and no child is turned away.




The Hattie B. Munroe Home has accommodations for forty-six convalescing and crippled children to age eighteen years. The home provides the living-in quarters for those children who are receiving treatment programs or attending school in the Center. Spacious, well equipped recreational facilities are available and ample training facilities are provided. Medical supervision is carried out by an organized staff in cooperation with the adjacent Children's Memorial Hospital.



The Dr. J. P. Lord School is an Omaha public school for physically handicapped children. The school offers the same elementary school curriculum given in our other public schools. In addition, physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech therapy are provided if it is prescribed by the child's physician. Children living outside the Omaha school district may attend the Dr. J. P. Lord School by special arrangement.





The University of Nebraska College of Medicine has a primary obligation of teaching students in Medicine, Nursing, Medical Technology, Radiologic Technology, and in graduate work in a number of specialized fields. As a part of this teaching the faculty provides medical care for many patients. Active research is conducted by most departments.

"The Creighton University School of Medicine and the University's Department of Nursing conduct major portions of their respective Pediatric training programs at the Childrens Medical Center.

"Organized instruction of medical students, interns and resident physicians is carried out continuously by the Department of Pediatrics of the School of Medicine which has also initiated and supervises the monthly Birth Defects Clinic."
