# **Enable Savings Plan**

The Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act is a federal law that allows people with disabilities to open tax-exempt savings accounts to save for disability-related expenses without impacting eligibility for resource-based benefits. In Nebraska, ABLE accounts are referred to as the Enable Savings Plan. An Enable account is a way for people with disabilities to save (cash, savings, etc.) in their name in a qualified ABLE account.


Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) is a disability benefit for people who can't work because they have a medical condition expected to last at least one year or result in death.
