



Close-to-implementation regional solutions

Region of the Americas

- >>> Emphasising and promoting the importance of oncologically sound cancer surgery
- >> Ensuring uniformity in the delivery and quality of cancer surgical care

European Region

- >> Accreditation of surgical oncology as a subspecialty
- >>> Extend EURECCA (European Registration of Cancer Care) initiatives to other cancers

Western Pacific Region

- >> Investments in the surgical ecosystem
- >>> Promoting equitable cancer surgical research practices
- >>> Streamline the pathways of surgical care

African region

- **>>>** Emphasising cancer surgery in the competing spectrum of other geographically relevant diseases
- >> Investments in cancer surgery professionals and care pathways

Eastern Mediterranean Region

- >> Improvements in infrastructure; specialised cancer centres
- >>> Mandating cancer surgery by qualified cancer surgeons

South-East Asian Region

- >>> Equal emphasis on regionalisation and decentralisation of cancer surgical services
- >>> Performance benchmarking
