Abraham Lincoln" President, Emancipator, Corporate Pitchman

Now – April 27, all day

Abraham Lincoln: President, Emancipator, Corporate Pitchman offers an innovative and immersive multi-sensory exploration of one of America's most iconic figures. Through tactile displays and detailed imagery, the exhibition sheds light on Lincoln's multifaceted roles – as a president who led the United States through the Civil War, an emancipator who took pivotal steps toward abolishing slavery and a corporate figure who, posthumously, became a symbol in modern advertising.

Job's Daughters International – Supporting 100 years of worldwide female leadership

Now – April 13, all day

Ethel T. Wead Mick founded The Order of Job's Daughters in Omaha, Nebraska, on October 20, 1920. Mick's goal was to develop an organization that gave young women leadership opportunities. During its first year, the Order's focus and work stayed within Nebraska. It soon grew beyond the state's borders with groups organized in 20 states and over 5,000 members by 1922. The Order extended into Canada in 1931, which marked the start of an international organization.

The group is known today as Job's Daughters International and is active in five countries, including the United States. What started as a mission to further engage young women in the Omaha community grew into a notable, international cause still embodying this mission today.

Annual Lecture with the Institute for Holocaust Education, Featuring Laurie Pasler

March 26, 6:30-7:30pm

After inheriting her father's concealed World War II memorabilia from his work at the Nuremberg war crimes trials, Laurie Pasler recognized a pressing need for education regarding this overlooked aspect of history. The Courtroom 600 project was born out of Laurie's frustration in researching the trials through available online resources — and hundreds of books. In 2016, she founded the Descendants Media Group NFP to preserve the legacy of Nuremberg and convey its lessons to future generations in a new way. Now, in partnership with educators, historians and digital media experts, she is actively bringing the Courtroom 600 project to life.

Chattin' with Dr. Chattleton: The 1975 Tornado

April 27, 1-2pm

May 6-8 marks the 50th anniversary of a powerful and devastating storm system. Nearly 40 tornadoes were sighted across the American Midwest during this three-day period, and among the most notable was an F4 tornado that tore through Omaha. Join Dr. Chattleton as we reflect on the tragedy of that natural disaster and how the community responded in its aftermath.

Habitat Hike:

March 16, 2-4pm

Join our Naturalist Educator for a guided hike through the Wetlands located at 103 Camp Gifford Road. Come along as we explore the various flora and fauna of the location. The guided hike will be from 2:00-4:00 PM, traversing easy to moderate terrain; please dress accordingly. Please note there are no facilities at the Wetlands, please plan accordingly. Free for members; \$25 for non-members. Pre-registration is required.

Forest Therapy

March 23, 1:30-3:30pm

Join us for a tranquil and rejuvenating 2-hour session of Forest Therapy led by Shannon Gorres, MDiv, MA, a certified nature and forest therapy guide with the Association of Nature and Forest Therapy. She has led hundreds of folks in discovering the beauty of their internal and external landscapes.

The program starts with a 20-minute guided meditation and then continues with sensory invitations that explore the environment in a mindful and bodyful way. This structured sequence that brings us into deeper connection was inspired by the Japanese practice of Shinrin-Yoku. We end with medicinal tea and sharing. Due to the relaxing nature of this event, we kindly request that participants are adults only. \$20 for members; \$28 for non-members.

Introduction to Birding

March 29, 8:30-10:30am

Do you enjoy watching birds in your backyard? Are you someone who wants to develop your birding interest into an active recreational hobby? Then sign up for Introduction to Birding!

This program will include a brief talk covering topics such as what makes Fontenelle Forest one of the top birding sites in Nebraska, some tips on finding small, fast-moving birds with binoculars, and a brief presentation on species we are most likely to see in the Forest. Then, we'll go on an easy-to-moderate hike, largely staying on the boardwalk. Please bring binoculars for the hiking portion; we also have some to borrow on a first come, first served basis. Finally, we will end the program with a look at some digital tools you can use on your smartphone! This program is strongly recommended for adults and families with children ages 12+. Minimum of 5 participants, maximum of 15 participants. \$10 for members; \$25 for non-members. Pre-registration is required.

Dirt Time

As the name suggests, this program can be messy, so please dress appropriately. We recommend bringing shoes that can get muddy, a pair of gloves to keep little hands clean, and a sense of adventure. This drop-in program is geared toward families with children but is accessible for curious folks of all ages. Wetlands Bird Walk

April 5, 9-10:30am

Grab your binoculars and join us for a Naturalist guided hike through the Wetlands in search of Pileated Woodpeckers and migratory birds making their way through the Forest in the early spring!

The program will be from 9:00am-10:30am, traversing through easy to moderate terrain. Be prepared with layers, good walking footwear, and a water bottle. Bringing binoculars is encouraged; extra binoculars will be available on a first come, first serve basis. \$10 for members; \$25 for non-members. Pre-registration is required.

Little Learners: Seasonal Science

Looking to explore the seasons with your little learner? Join us for our new program learning what happens in the forest as the seasons change – Little Learners: Seasonal Science! We'll discuss what animals do as the seasons change, and explore science stations focused on the spring or fall.
