STORYTELLERS: ARTISTS FROM OUR OWN BACKYARD

Now – August 31, all day

The group is known today as Job's Daughters International and is active in five countries, including the United States. What started as a mission to further engage young women in the Omaha community grew into a notable, international cause still embodying this mission today. In conjunction with *The Animation Academy*, The Durham Museum has developed a companion exhibition featuring artists and storytellers from Nebraska whose work in various media is inspiring dreamers of all generations. Through cartoons, illustrations, mixed media, musical compositions and computer animation, the work of these artists helps a story jump off the page. The display features examples from comic books and children's books to the big screen and shows how Nebraskan artists tell different types of stories through their work. Featured artists include: Bruce Arant, Michael Burton, Caitlin Cass, Trent Claus, Drew Conley, Bob Hall, Timothy James Hantula, Cale Oglesby, Henry Payer and Chip Thompson.

NATURE'S WRATH: THE 1975 TORNADO

Now – August 3, all day

Fifty years ago, two days of intense storms hit the Midwest. On May 6, 1975, the air was humid and the skies continued to darken in Omaha. The first report of tornado sightings came just after 4PM. By 5PM, the twister had dispersed and significant damage had taken place within that hour. Photographers captured moments such as the tornado's approach, seen best through winner's circle photos taken from the Ak-Sar-Ben racetrack, and the destruction left behind. What they also captured, however, were the citizens and first responders out on the streets assisting wherever possible. Using images from the Photo Archive, see the impact of this storm from different viewpoints and a community coming together in its aftermath. OMAHA'S WORLD'S FAIR OF AVIATION, 1946

Now – September 7, all day

Omaha's Offutt Field hosted the World's Fair of Aviation in July 1946. With an event anticipated to be "the biggest thing that Omaha has done since the Trans-Mississippi Exposition," the Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben stepped up as a sponsor to accomplish the task. The event included an indoor exhibit space of 120,000 square feet and also featured air shows with a wide range of military aircraft. In terms of attendance, anywhere from 80,000 to over 100,000 people experienced this incredible local spectacle." This nine-photo display features images ranging from a German V-2 rocket and "Flying Boxcar" aircraft to the opening ceremony's ribbon cutting, and was curated by The Durham Museum intern, Mina Bussa, University of Nebraska at Omaha student.

Museum Insider: Photo Archive in a Flash! THE IMPEACHMENT OF JUSTICE SAMUEL CHASE

Now – November 2, all day

As the United States approached its 30th birthday in 1804, the nation's leaders faced various challenges of running a young country. There were two political parties, the Federalists and the Democratic-Republicans, competing for influence in government positions and a notable impeachment that set a precedent for the checks and balances between government branches. Supreme Court Justice Samuel Chase was the first, and only, Supreme Court Justice impeached by Congress, though he was acquitted of all charges. To learn how it played out, visit this display and view items from the Byron Reed Collection that are connected to this decisive trial. Habitat Hike

Foodie Forest Fridays

June 13, July 11, 18, 25 and August 29, 12-6pm

Fontenelle Forest is partnering up with local food trucks to serve up delicious food truck eats on select Fridays from 12pm – 6pm outside the Nature Center. Fuel up for your hike or bring the whole family to play at Acorn Acres and enjoy a well-deserved meal afterwards. Food must be purchased on site, separate from daily admission or membership costs. Plus, enjoy extended hours at the Forest this summer (Monday – Friday) until 7pm, starting May 27. Food truck fare varies from sweet treats such as ice cream and snow cones to comfort food like tacos and BBQ.

Summer Birding Walk

June 28, 9-10:30am

Join us on a steamy summer morning as the Forests' migratory birds put on a show! Vireos, tanagers, flycatchers, and more are thick in the Forest, so grab your binoculars and join one of our Naturalists as we traverse the boardwalk and nearby trails on this easy-to-moderate, slow-paced hike. Whether you're a new or experienced birder, summer is the season to identify new birds or see some old favorites. Binoculars are available to borrow on a first-come, first-served basis. Pack a water bottle and bring a good pair of walking shoes! *\$10 for members; \$25 for non-members.* Pre-registration is required.

Dirt Time

June 28, July 26, August 30, 9-10am

Join us at Acorn Acres to explore tracks, scat, and more to find out who has been visiting our play area! As the name suggests, this program can be messy, so please dress appropriately. We recommend bringing shoes that can get muddy, a pair of gloves to keep little hands clean, and a sense of adventure. This drop-in program is geared toward families with children but is accessible for curious folks of all ages. In the case of inclement weather, indoor activities will be available. *Free for members; regular admission for non-members.*

Statewide Arboretum Native Plant Sale

Please bring a folding chair or blanket to sit on while stargazing and be ready to hike a short distance on easy to moderate terrain with your chair to our stargazing viewing area. Firefly Tracking: Community Science Day

June 21, 8:30-10:30pm

Come enjoy dusk at the Forest as we learn about fireflies, including the ones in your own backyard! These flashing, flickering insects need our help as their populations have been declining over the years – but scientists and citizens like you can help change that! Whether you call them fireflies or lightning bugs, this is your opportunity to join our naturalist educators as we learn about the nation-wide Firefly Atlas project, participate in counting fireflies on site, and take home the resources you need to continue this important work at home. This program is geared toward adults and families with science-minded children due to the upper-level concepts and meticulous activities we will be engaging with. Parents and guardians are responsible for any children in their care. Please bring a flashlight or headlamp or borrow one of ours on a first-come, first-served basis. Hiking to count fireflies on-site will be on easy-to-moderate, on the Boardwalk and surrounding trails. *\$15 for members; \$25 for non-members.* Pre-registration is required.

Beetles in the Wetlands: Community Science Day

June 27, 8:30-10:30pm

Are you curious about what critters live under logs? What creepy crawlies come out at night? Join us in the Wetlands as we're joined by entomology enthusiast, Andy! Plan for a night hike on easy terrain as we search for beetles that come out at night in the Wetlands. Once we catch beetles and other insects, we'll identify them and record the data on iNaturalist. Long pants and bug spray are HIGHLY encouraged. We recommend that participants bring their own flashlights or headlamps; we will have a limited number of flashlights and lanterns available. This program is geared toward adults and families with science-minded children due to the upper-level concepts and meticulous activities we will be engaging with. Parents and guardians are responsible for any children in their care. *\$15 for members; \$25 for non- members.* Pre-registration is required.

Fungus Among Us

June 22, 2-3:30pm

Have you ever seen an ear growing out of a tree? Gray fingers sticking out of the ground? Or red cups lining the edge of the trail? These fascinating fungi – and more! - all grow here at the Forest! Join a Naturalist Educator and a member of the Nebraska Mycological Society as we explore the myriad of mushrooms that grow throughout the year. This is a program you "mush" make "room" for in your schedule! Bring your hiking boots, a water bottle, and a sense of adventure as we traverse easy-to-moderate terrain looking for fungus. This event will occur twice per year; once at the Nature Center in June to look at early-season fungi, and once at Camp Wa-Kon-Da in October to look for fall fungi. *\$10 for members; \$25 for non-members.* Pre-registration is required.

Raptor Talk

July 6 and August 3, 11am-noon

Not every meat-eating bird is a raptor. A raptor is a carnivorous bird that has The Four Sharps: a sharp, hooked beak, sharp talons, sharp eyesight, and sharp hearing. This summer, join Raptor Care Specialist Ell Kinsey in the Raptor Woodland Refuge from 11:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. on the first Sunday of the month to meet a raptor ambassador, handle some artifacts, and learn a thing or two about what makes a raptor a raptor. *This event is free for members or with daily admission for non-members.*

Twilight Trekking

June 28, 8:30-10:30pm

Join us in this unique opportunity to see the Forest at night! Don't miss your chance to learn about the nocturnal creatures who call the Forest home while exploring new trails. This hike is geared toward intermediate to experienced hikers (ages 16+) and will traverse at least two miles of moderate to difficult terrain, so please come prepared with appropriate clothing and gear. Our educators recommend the following, as applicable: long pants, tall socks, water bottle, bug spray, winter coat, scarf, and/or gloves. *Please check the weather as you are preparing for this event – safety of our guests is our top priority. \$10 for members; \$25 for non-members.* Pre-registration is required.

If you don't have a yoga mat, we suggest bringing an alternative such as a thick towel or blanket to provide some cushioning and grip during your practice. National Moth Week Survey: Community Science Day

Join us in celebrating National Moth Week with a night of community science! Did you know that there are over 1300 species of moths in Nebraska?
