# Visual Learners...

- Follow directions well
- Visualize while listening
- Are usually very organized
- Prefer colorful visuals
- Have a tendency to notice similarities and differences in visual appearance
- Can actually see their notes in their mind
- Easily envision imagery

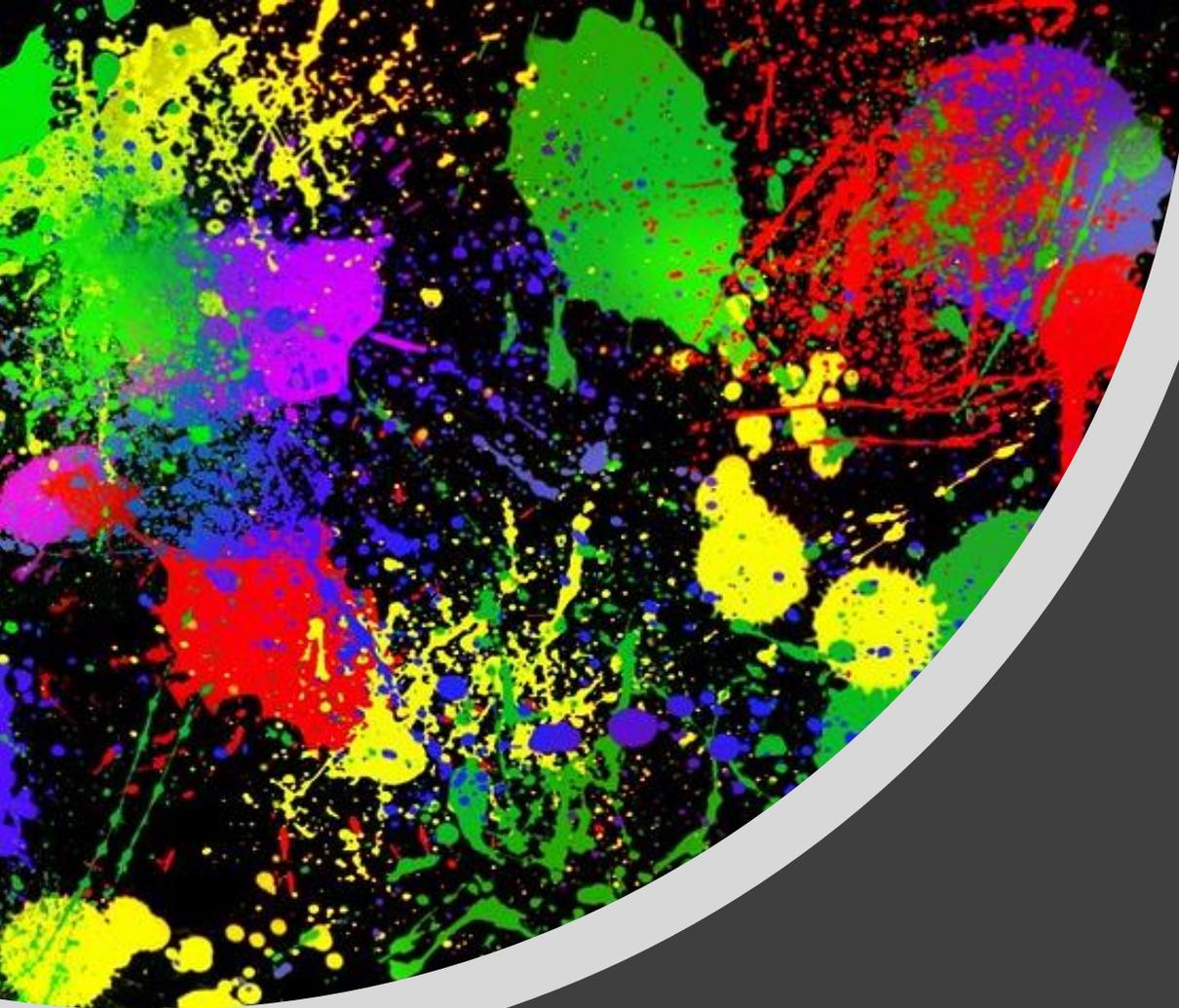




# Study Strategies

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- Color code your notes
- Use concept maps and diagrams
- Use colorful flashcards
- Take notes in table format (such the Stanford method)
- If utilizing a Supplemental Instruction Leader, ask them to draw things out while they explain and take a picture
- Read the text or notes in 25 minute intervals and underline/highlight in color- review after a short break, continue until done
- After completing your studying in 25 minute intervals, go back over all the underlined/highlighted items before ending your study session



# Test Strategies

- Close your eyes and think about those last minute concepts you just reviewed and "brain dump" on your scratch paper
- Try to visualize your notes/powerpoints during the exam
- Try to jot down the different colors you used for certain content to help jog your memory in the exam
- Draw out diagrams or flowcharts on scratch paper
- Use a piece of paper to cover other answers while you thoroughly read one at a time
- Don't be afraid to close your eyes and visualize videos/notes/diagrams/tables etc...
