The Department of Orthopaedic Surgery's Annual Resident Research Forum is scheduled for Friday, October 26th, and will feature guest speaker Dr. Wayne Paprosky of Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush University Medical Center.



Dr. Paprosky is a professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Rush University Medical Center. He specializes in hip and knee reconstruction and replacement, and developed the Paprosky Classification, used worldwide for performing revision surgery. Dr. Paprosky's research interests are trabecular metal for revisions, metal corrosion related to metal on metal implants, and Radiostereometric Analysis (RSA).

During the forum, residents (PGY II - V) will give a brief talk, followed by a closing presentation from Dr. Paprosky entitled, "Revision THA how far have we come?" The resident research forum is an annual event, designed to help residents plan their research projects and keep them on track through their final year of residency.

The forum will take place in the Michael F. Sorrell Center for Health Science Education, Room 2018, from 7:30-11:00 a.m.
