- 1. Assessment of current public health initiatives statewide
- 2. Collaboration with PHAN, Nebraska Hospital Association and COPH HRSA program on bridging the gap between hospitals and public health
- 3. Create a PHAN historical database
- 4. Work with Advocacy committee on development of an Advocacy charter of advocacy efforts for PHAN
- 5. Assessment of messaging impact on PHAN membership
- 6. Assessment of PHAN's reach to engage with rural public health initiatives
- 7. Work with PHAN Communications Committee on messaging initiatives

#### **Timeframe of proposed activities:**

Fall 2023 Semester

Work on each of the above-mentioned activities could be accomplished in 100 hours.

#### Benefit of proposed activities to partner organization:

As an association with no paid staff at this time, any of the proposed activities will help to establish a foundational infrastructure or provide needed data to assist with advocacy efforts or funding requests.

#### **Benefit of proposed activities to the student:**

Students will have the opportunity to work directly with association board of directors and partnering organizations (for some projects). This will provide the student with relationships with public health leaders, a deeper understanding of the breadth of public health work in Nebraska as well as experience serving alongside a Board of Directors.
