#### • Data Collection

- o Assist in developing and distributing surveys, questionnaires, and interview tools.
- o Collect data through field visits (*if applicable*), interviews, focus groups, or online platforms.
- o Enter, clean, and organize data using software tools

## • Data Analysis

- o Conduct preliminary analysis of quantitative and qualitative data.
- o Create basic charts, graphs, and tables to summarize findings.
- o Assist in identifying trends, gaps, or patterns in program data.

### Reporting, Communication, and Storytelling

- o Contribute to drafting manuscripts for peer reviews, reports, and newsletters.
- o Support the creation of infographics and visualizations to communicate impact.
- o Help translate technical findings into accessible language for community audiences.

#### • Literature Reviews

- o Conduct (or contribute to) literature reviews focused on environmental exposures and adverse human health outcomes.
- o Synthesize findings to share with wider audiences.
