

Generational Safety: Mid-Life Farmers on the Farm



Who's at Risk on the Farm? Mid-Life Farmers

- Farmers have a lot of exposure to grain and livestock dust
- Exposure to dust puts farmers at a higher risk for
 - Allergy Systems
 - Cough
 - Nose and Sinus Symptoms
 - Asthma Symptoms
 - Organic Dust Toxic Syndrome (ODTS)
 - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- Proper use of an N95 approved mask in dusty conditions will lower your risk

Masks Should...



Fit tightly without gaps



Be appropriate for the task
