Who's at Risk on the Farm? Young and Beginning Farmers

- Agriculture continues to be one of the most dangerous occupations in the United States
- Due to a lack of farming experience, farmers and ranchers who have been farming for less than 10 years are at a greater risk for injury
- Transportation incidents, including tractors and ATVs, cause the most fatalities on farms
- Common hazards in farming include respiratory hazards, noise, and chemical hazards
- There are many training and educational resources available for young and beginning farmers
- Creating a safety plan and completing health and safety checklists are good ways to maintain a safe work enviornment
