




# GASOLINE SAFETY

- · Gasoline is highly flammable and dangerous.
- · NEVER touch gasoline unless an adult is around to help.
- · NEVER mix gasoline and fire.
- Gasoline should only be used as fuel; never as an accelerant, cleaner, degreaser, solvent, paint thinner, or weed killer.
- If your clothing catches on fire, STOP, DROP AND ROLL.
   (Stop, drop to the ground, and cover your face with your hands.
   Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.)






Did you know? A safety device, called a flame arrestor, installed in the spout of a portable gasoline container will dissipate the flames and prevent an explosion.



## Did you know?

- Many portable gasoline containers in use today are outdated and not equipped with a flame arrestor.
- You can exchange your old, outdated portable gasoline container for a new safety gas can, equipped with a flame arrestor, for free at The Legacy of Christopher Allsup Gas Can Exchange, held annually since 2014!



• A type B fire extinguisher is designed to extinguish fires involving flammable and combustible liquids. One should always be kept near gasoline storage areas.








#### SAFETY SCENARIOS

## Did you know?

- Refueling should always be done outdoors. When refueling equipment like lawn mowers and tractors, the engine should be allowed to cool completely. Gasoline spilled on a hot engine could easily ignite and cause serious burns.
- When refueling at a gas station, adults should always turn the vehicle off,
   refrain from cell phone use, and never smoke.







well-ventilated area, away from heat, and out of reach of children.










 All flammable fuels should be properly labeled and stored in approved, color-coded containers: red for gasoline, yellow for diesel, and blue for kerosene.



- 4. The new gas can should be a safety gasoline container that is UL listed and equipped with a flame arrestor.
- Refer to **GASOLINE SAFETY** on page 1 and "Did you know?" 5. sections throughout booklet.
- Some examples: diesel fuel, kerosene, propane, oil, alcohol. 6. oil-based paints.
- 7. STOP, DROP AND ROLL (Stop, drop to the ground, and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.)
- 8. Keep calm. Note your surroundings (street address, landmarks). Be patient. Follow directions. Stay on the line.
