TODDLERS ON THE FARM





TODDLERS ARE AT RISK ON THE FARM

- Childhood farm injuries and fatalities most often occur while children are playing in an agricultural worksite, or are bystanders to agricultural work.
- Children younger than 10 years old experience one of the highest rates of pediatric farm-related injury.
- Every 3 days a child dies in an agriculture-related incident and 33 children are injured in agriculturerelated injuries each day.
- 40% of children's farm deaths are caused by tractors.
- Toddlers should be physically separated from the occupational and environmental hazards associated with agricultural worksites.
- Safe play areas are an alternative to bringing children into the worksite, especially when off-farm childcare is not available. (See back for more details)
