Dr. David M. Mahvi is the President of Northwestern Medical Group. Dr. Mahvi also currently serves as Chief of Gastrointestinal and Oncologic Surgery and as the Vice Chair for Clinical Affairs in the Department of Surgery.

Dr. Mahvi came to Northwestern Memorial in 2008 from the University of Wisconsin where his responsibilities included heading an NIH funded research lab, chairing the compensation committee of their faculty practice plan and serving as director of the surgical residency program. He has remained active in research at Northwestern, working on research projects through NuVention which helps establish new biomedical companies. He is also a professor of biomedical engineering at the McCormick School of Engineering.

Dr. Mahvi completed his undergraduate work in Microbiology at the University of Oklahoma and went on to obtain his MD at the Medical University of South Carolina. He then served his residency and completed a research fellowship in Immunology at Duke University Medical Center. His clinical interests include the surgical treatment of upper gastrointestinal malignancies (liver, pancreas and stomach) and liver tumor ablation for colorectal cancers. His research interests focus on the development of new biomedical devices in the treatment of liver cancer.

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
