Daniel T. Dempsey, MD, MBA is Professor of Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania, where he serves as Chief of GI Surgery and Assistant Director of Perioperative Services. From 2000-2011 he was the George and Louise Peters Professor and Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Temple University. His clinical practice is limited to gastrointestinal and laparoscopic surgery.

Dr. Dempsey is a magna cum laude graduate of Princeton University (AB in classics) and attended medical school at the University of Rochester, where he received the Class of 1976 Prize for clinical excellence. He did his surgical residency at the University of Pennsylvania and was elected to AOA. Recently he was awarded his MBA with distinction from the Fox Business School at Temple University.
